Ezekiel 36:22-27, Acts 2:42-47



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Introduction:

Is the fellowship of the Body a priority in your life?

Ezekiel 36:22-27

“Therefore say to the house of Israel, Thus says the Lord GOD: It is not for your sake, O house of Israel, that I am about to act, but for the sake of my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations to which you came. And I will vindicate the holiness of my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned among them. And the nations will know that I am the LORD, declares the Lord GOD, when through you I vindicate my holiness before their eyes. I will take you from the nations and gather you from all the countries and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules.

- God has given us a new heart, spirit and put His Spirit within us so that we might bring him glory (thereby reversing the fall, that we might bear His image to the world).
- See also Ephesians 1:3-6, Ephesians 3:20-21 and John 12:27-28

Acts 2:1-4

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

- The Spirit was poured out when the body was gathered.
- Most often, they were filled with the Spirit when they were gathered together in one heart and mind.

Acts 2:42-47

And they devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common.

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And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

- Fellowship is defined as active participation in a common life
- Fellowship is a life we hold in common with God through Christ and with one another in the Spirit.

Is the fellowship of the body a priority in your life?

Fellowship, sharing life together takes nurturing relationships, mutual participation and time invested.
